Jayden also spoke about the deep cultural significance of the land in Aboriginal culture. We were privileged to have the Moorditi Mob from Wesley College join us to perform traditional dances and later work with our Year 5 students to make damper, a memorable cultural experience for all involved. As part of the assembly, we officially launched the new block names. Ken Aitchison provided the community with valuable insights into our Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP), sharing the story of Marmion Primary School's RAP journey so far. He spoke

## **Renaming of Learning Block Names**

This year, we've taken a special step to celebrate and recognise local Noongar culture in our school.

As part of our cultural learning journey, we're proud to share that our school blocks now have new names inspired by local native animals in Noongar language. These names were chosen to connect us to the land and stories of this place.

The new block names are:

Pre Primary - Yoorn – which means bobtail lizard Year 1 and 2 blocks - Koolbardi – which means magpie Year 3 and 4 blocks - Kwenda – which means bandicoot Year 4 to 6 on the verandah - Djidi Djidi – which means willy wagtail

These animals are all special to Noongar Country, and each one represents resilience, adaptability, and connection to nature.

We hope these names will spark curiosity and pride in our school community.

## Character Strengths The Importance of Developing Kindness in Children

Kindness is more than good manners or polite behaviour—it is a powerful character trait that shapes how children interact with the world. Developing kindness in children from an early age not only improves their relationships but also builds emotional intelligence, empathy, and resilience.

Children who are taught to be kind learn to consider the feelings of others, recognise different perspectives, and respond with compassion. These skills are essential for forming positive social connections and navigating conflicts constructively. In classrooms, kind behaviour leads to more inclusive and respectful environments, reducing bullying and increasing a sense of belonging for all students.

Kindness also has lasting benefits for a child's mental health. Research shows that performing kind acts boosts self-esteem, lowers anxiety, and strengthens overall well-being. When children experience the positive feedback that comes from helping others, it reinforces their sense of purpose and connectedness.

Importantly, kindness can be taught and nurtured. Adults play a vital role in modelling kind behaviour—children often learn more from what they see than what they are told. Encouraging small acts of generosity, listening with empathy, and acknowledging efforts to help others all support a culture of kindness at home and at school.

In a world that can often feel divided or overwhelming, raising kind children contributes to stronger communities and a more compassionate society. When we teach children to value kindness, we equip them with the tools to make a positive impact throughout their lives.
