BE BRAVE

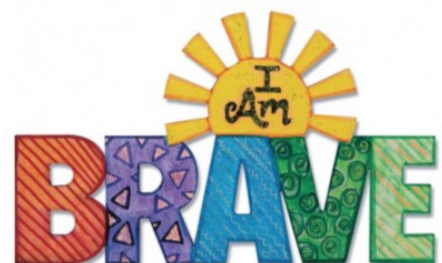

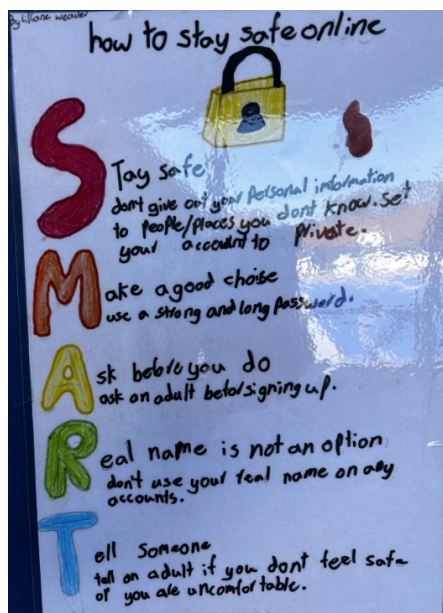

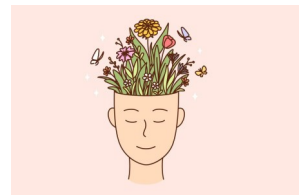
## Reflect, Learn, Grow

As part of our ongoing commitment to creating a safe, supportive, and positive learning environment, we have recently reviewed and strengthened our whole-school behaviour processes. Our focus is on helping students take responsibility for their actions, build positive relationships, and learn from their experiences.

A key part of this process is the use of Reflection Sheets. Students may be referred to the Administration team for consistent low-level behaviours or more significant incidents. This provides a circuit breaker, allowing the student a short time away from the classroom to reflect, reset, and discuss their choices with a member of the Administration team.

Reflection Sheets are designed to support student growth, accountability, and relationship restoration by encouraging students to reflect on their behaviour and consider strategies for future success. When a Reflection Sheet is completed, it is shared with parents to maintain open communication and strengthen the partnership between home and school.

Reflection Sheets are not intended as a punishment, but rather as an opportunity for students, families, and staff to work together to understand what happened, repair relationships where needed, and develop positive strategies moving forward. If your child brings home a Reflection sheet, we encourage families to use the Reflection sheet as a starting point for a supportive conversation with their child so that, together, we can help students be successful learners and positive members of our school community.



## A SPECIAL PLACE TO LEARN & GROW.

Every now and then, we are reminded just how fortunate we are to call Marmion Primary School home. Recently, one of our wonderful Pre-Primary teachers, Jess Beech, captured a beautiful photo that perfectly reflects the unique environment in which our children learn each day. Surrounded by natural bushland, native wildlife and the sounds of nature, it served as a gentle reminder that our school is truly something special. Research continues to show the positive impact that natural environments have on wellbeing. Time spent amongst trees and nature can help reduce stress, improve focus, encourage curiosity and promote a sense of calm and belonging. ## One Big Voice Auditions

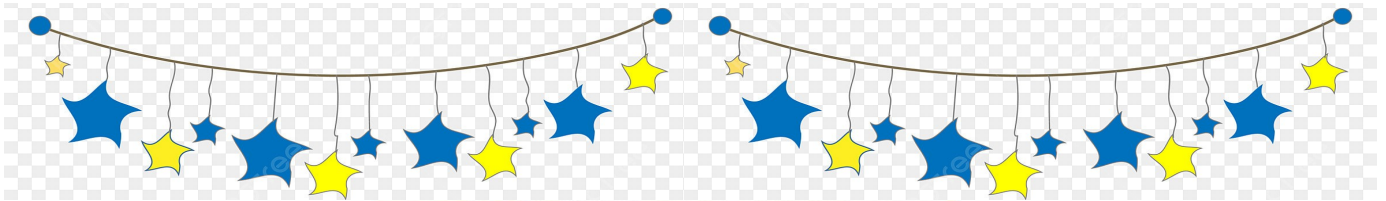

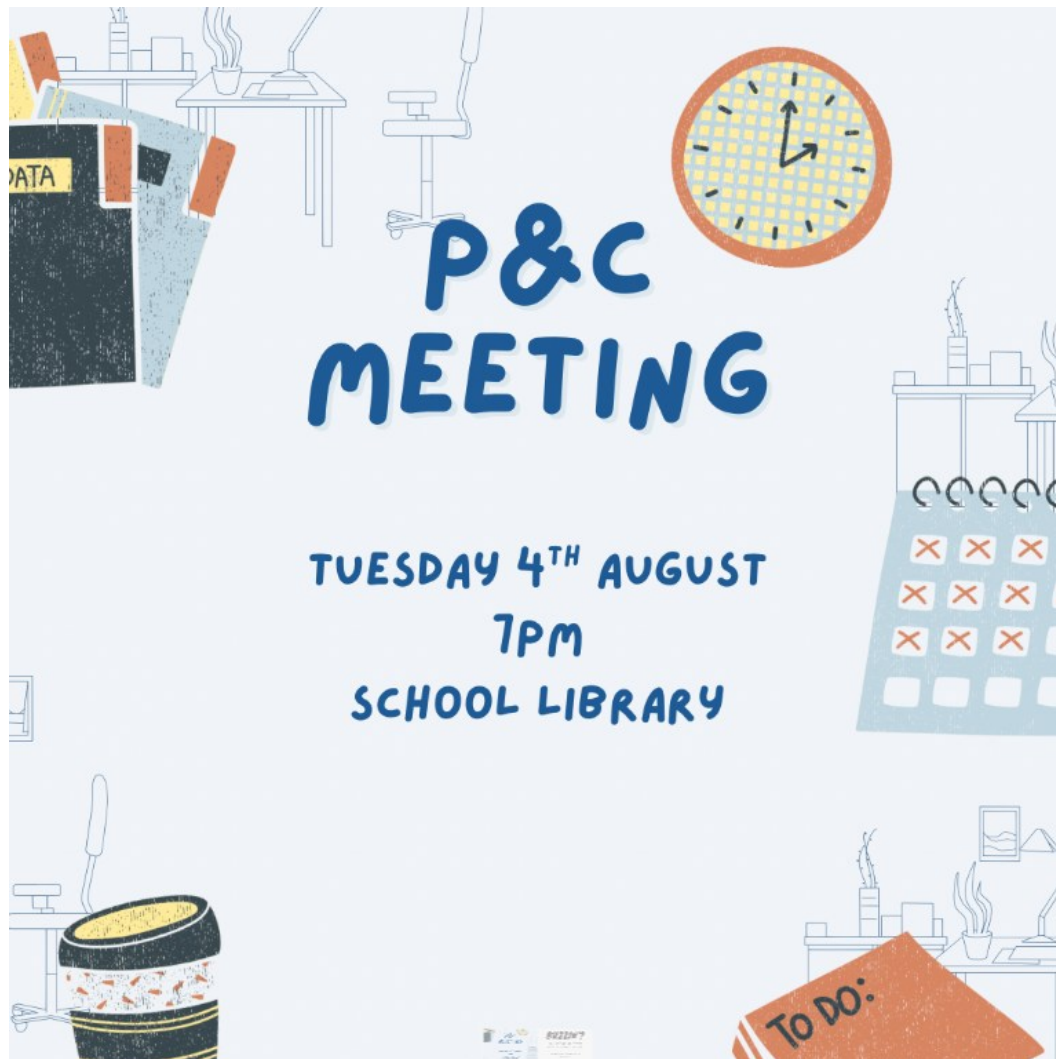

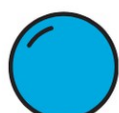
