If you walk into our Kindy and see children building, creating, digging, imagining, exploring or getting wonderfully messy, you are seeing learning in action.

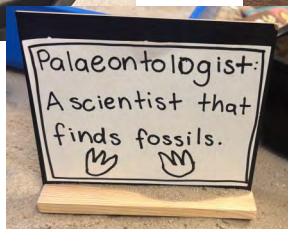
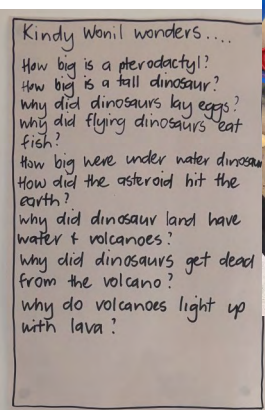
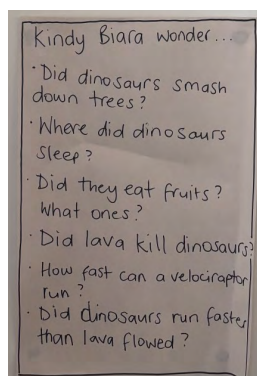
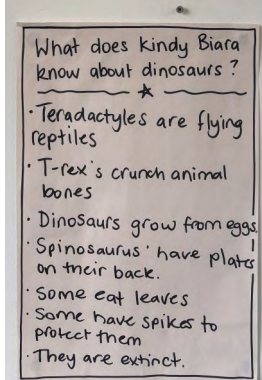
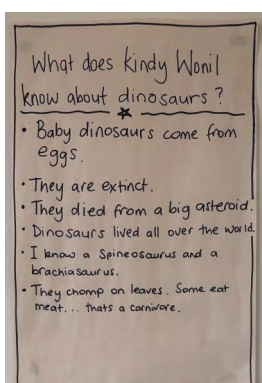
In the early years, play is how children learn. Through play, children develop language, early literacy and numeracy skills, creativity, problem-solving, resilience, independence and the ability to work with others.

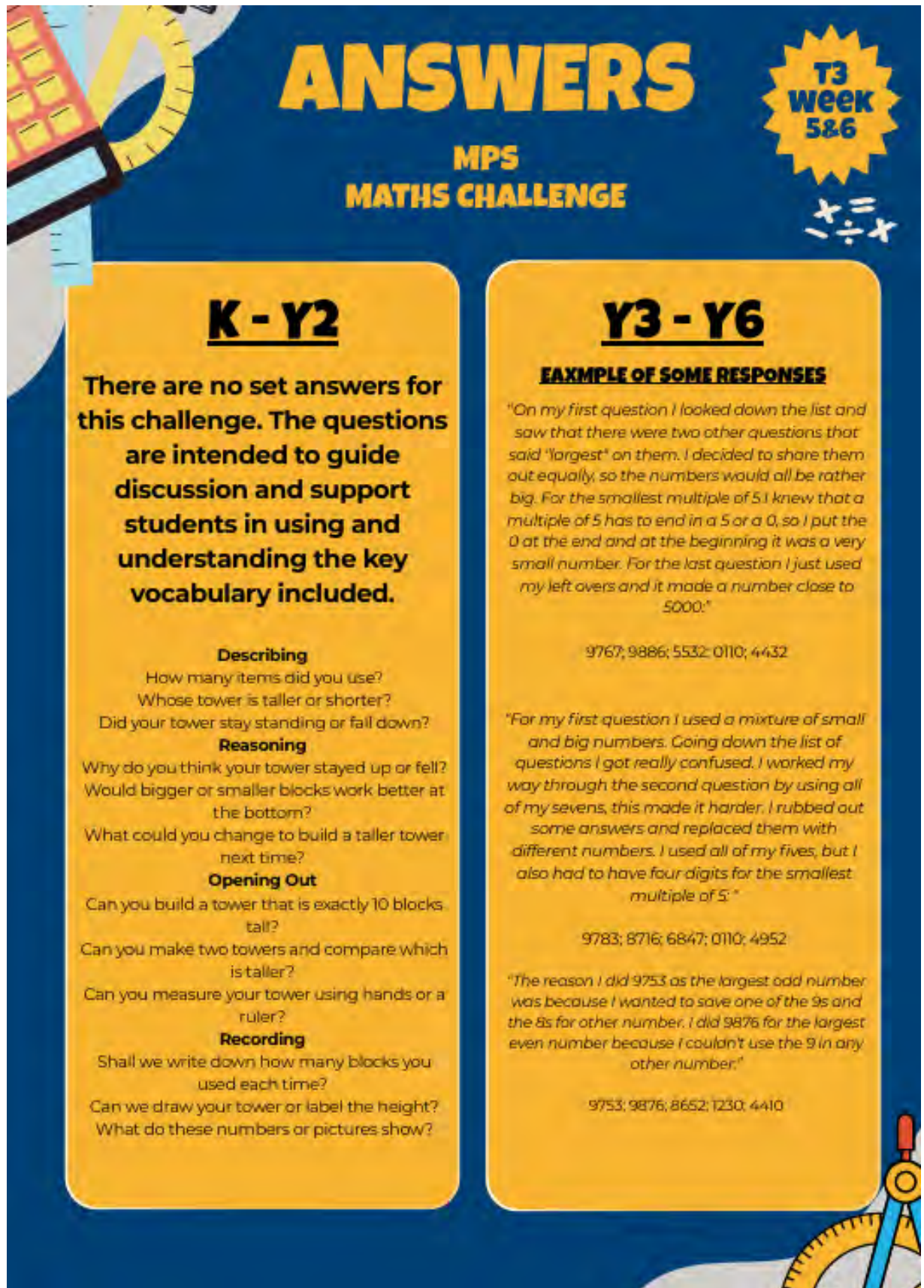
Our Kindy teachers thoughtfully guide and extend these experiences, ensuring that play is both joyful and purposeful.

There are no set answers for this challenge. The questions are intended to guide discussion and support students in using and understanding the key vocabulary included.

Describing
How many items did you use?
Whose tower is taller or shorter?
Did your tower stay standing or fall down?

Reasoning
Why do you think your tower stayed up or fell?
Would bigger or smaller blocks work better at the bottom?
What could you change to build a taller tower next time?

Opening Out
Can you build a tower that is exactly 10 blocks tall?
Can you make two towers and compare which is taller?
Can you measure your tower using hands or a ruler?

Recording
Shall we write down how many blocks you used each time?
Can we draw your tower or label the height?
What do these numbers or pictures show?

Y3 - Y6

EXAMPLE OF SOME RESPONSES

"On my first question I looked down the list and saw that there were two other questions that said "largest" on them. I decided to share them out equally, so the numbers would all be rather big. For the smallest multiple of 5 I knew that a multiple of 5 has to end in a 5 or a 0, so I put the 0 at the end and at the beginning it was a very small number. For the last question I just used my left overs and it made a number close to 5000:"

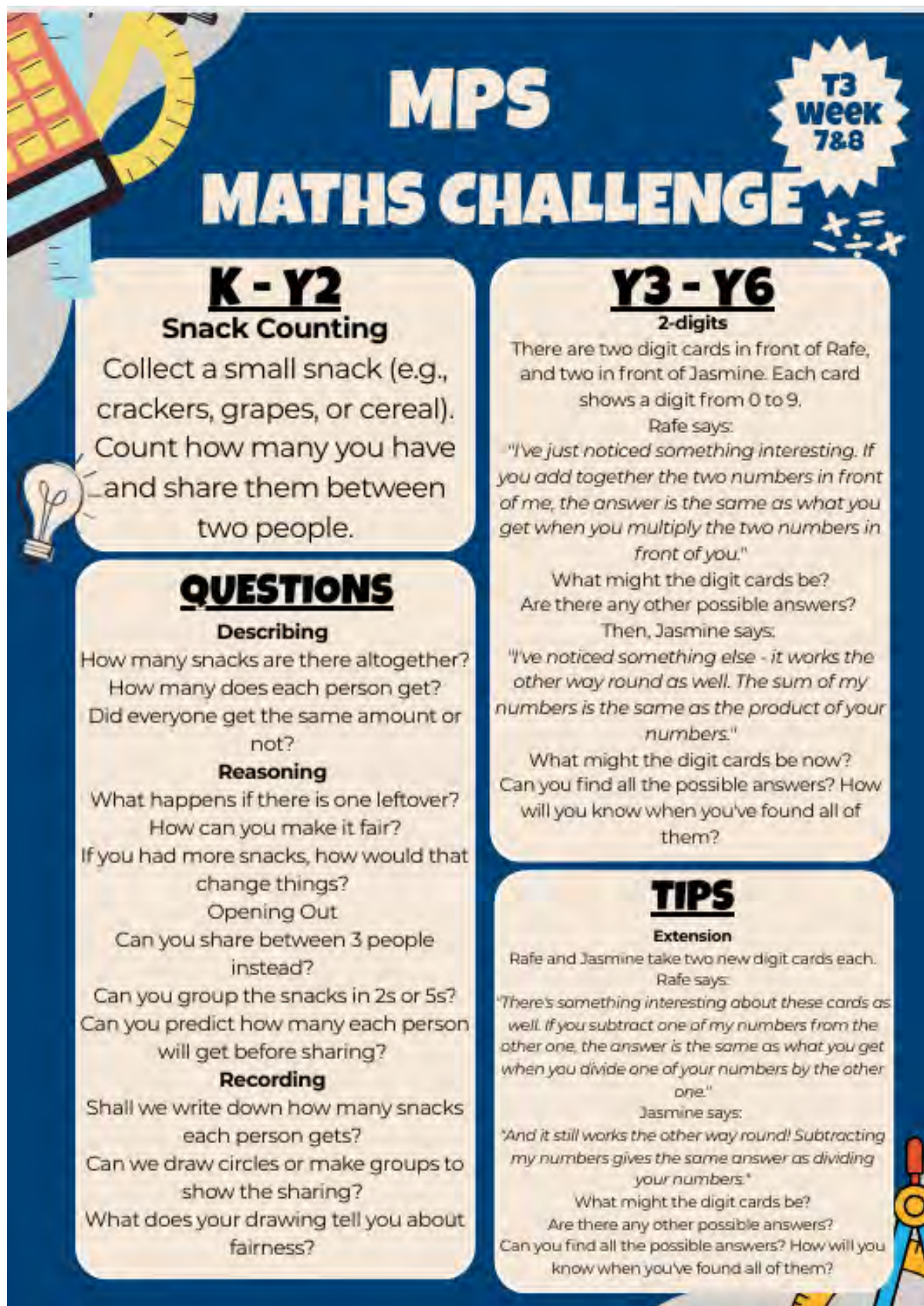

"For my first question I used a mixture of small and big numbers. Going down the list of questions I got really confused. I worked my way through the second question by using all of my sevens, this made it harder. I rubbed out some answers and replaced them with different numbers. I used all of my fives, but I also had to have four digits for the smallest multiple of 5:"

9783; 8716; 6847; 0110; 4952

"The reason I did 9753 as the largest odd number was because I wanted to save one of the 9s and the 8s for other number. I did 9876 for the largest even number because I couldn't use the 9 in any other number:"

9753; 9876; 8652; 1230; 4410

Snack Counting

Collect a small snack (e.g., crackers, grapes, or cereal). Count how many you have and share them between two people.

QUESTIONS

Describing

How many snacks are there altogether?
How many does each person get?
Did everyone get the same amount or not?

Reasoning

What happens if there is one leftover?
How can you make it fair?
If you had more snacks, how would that change things?
Opening Out
Can you share between 3 people instead?
Can you group the snacks in 2s or 5s?
Can you predict how many each person will get before sharing?

Recording

Shall we write down how many snacks each person gets?
Can we draw circles or make groups to show the sharing?
What does your drawing tell you about fairness?

Y3 - Y6
2-digits

There are two digit cards in front of Rafe, and two in front of Jasmine. Each card shows a digit from 0 to 9.

Rafe says:
"I've just noticed something interesting. If you add together the two numbers in front of me, the answer is the same as what you get when you multiply the two numbers in front of you."

What might the digit cards be?
Are there any other possible answers?
Then, Jasmine says:
"I've noticed something else - it works the other way round as well. The sum of my numbers is the same as the product of your numbers."

What might the digit cards be now?
Can you find all the possible answers? How will you know when you've found all of them?

TIPS

Extension

Rafe and Jasmine take two new digit cards each.

Rafe says:
"There's something interesting about these cards as well. If you subtract one of my numbers from the other one, the answer is the same as what you get when you divide one of your numbers by the other one."

Jasmine says:
"And it still works the other way round! Subtracting my numbers gives the same answer as dividing your numbers."

What might the digit cards be?
Are there any other possible answers?
Can you find all the possible answers? How will you know when you've found all of them?

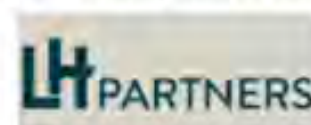
